Admissions Policy for Entry in August 2022 and in-year from August 2022

The College follows Guidance and Advice given by the Government when writing policies; in light of this, changes may need to be made after the adoption of this policy and prior to the review date.

Admissions Policy

For entry in August 2022 and in-year from August 2022

Purpose Of This Policy

The purpose of the policy is to ensure that places at Castle Donington College are allocated and offered in an open and fair way.

Applying For A Place

A parent can apply for a place for their child at any state-funded school in any area. Parents apply to the local authority in which they live for a place at Castle Donington College and any other preferred schools. (For the College, this is usually Leicestershire).

Parents must apply through the LA online system or using the Local Authority's Common Application Form. The application form must be completed and submitted or returned by the national closing date. The annual closing date is 31 October for a place the following academic year.

Children with an Educational Health and Care Plan (EHCP)

Children with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) that names Castle Donington College in the plan, will be admitted first. The Special Educational Needs Service can request that the school offer a place to a student with SEND who has nominated Castle Donington College. In this instance a place would usually be offered regardless of whether the College is full.

The Decision

The Published Admission Number (PAN) for entry in August 2022 is **136** students.

Castle Donington will admit this number of students if sufficient applications are received. All applicants will be admitted if these numbers or fewer apply.

If Castle Donington College is undersubscribed, any parent that applies will be offered a place.

When there are more applications for the College than there are places available, oversubscription criteria set out below will be applied. This criterion will decide which children to admit until the number of offers we make matches our PAN of 136 or any number above our PAN which has been determined by the Governors and to which the Local Authority have been notified in accordance with the Admissions Code of Practice.

Oversubscription Criteria

When there are more applications for the College than there are places available, the following criteria will be used to allocate places (in the order listed):

1	A 'looked after child' or a child who was previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption, residence, or special guardianship order. A looked after child is a child who is (a) in the care of a local authority, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social services functions (see the definition in section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989). This extends to those in care outside of England.
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2	Children in the Castle Donington College Catchment Area.
3	Children with a sibling attending Castle Donington College in Year 7,8,9,10 at the time of application. Sibling is defined in these arrangements as children who live as brother or sister in the same house, including natural brothers or sisters, adopted siblings, stepbrothers or sisters and foster brothers or sisters.
4	Children currently attending a feeder primary school. The designated feeder schools are <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Orchard Primary School • Hemington Primary School • St. Edward’s Church of England Primary School • St. Hardulph’s Church of England Primary School • Long Whatton Church of England Primary School • Diseworth Church of England Primary School • Kegworth Primary School
5	Children who live nearest to Castle Donington College measured in a straight-line distance (home to front gate- as the crow flies). Castle Donington College, Mount Pleasant, Castle Donington Derbyshire, DE74 2LN

Tie Break Arrangements

Where the number of applications exceeds the number of places available, children will be put in priority order by using a combination of the highest criterion and distance. Distances are measured in a straight line from the centre point of the property to the school’s main designated front gate, using a computerised mapping system.

Random allocation will be used in a tie-break to decide who has highest priority for admission if the distance between two children’s homes and Castle Donington College is the same.

Some admission authorities use other criteria when allocating places. For the purposes of clarity, Castle Donington College does not allocate places on the basis of faith, ability or aptitude.

Castle Donington College may need to ask for proof of the following when applying the oversubscription criteria: Address, Child’s date of birth, a copy of an adoption order, residence order or special guardianship order and a letter from the Local Authority that last looked after the child confirming that he or she was looked after immediately prior to that order being made.

Parents receive an offer from the local authority at the highest preference school at which a place is available on 1 March or the first working day thereafter in the year in which the child will be admitted.

Right to Appeal

Parents, and in some circumstances children, have the right to appeal against Castle Donington College’s decision to refuse admission. Parents will be informed that, if they wish to appeal, they must set out

their grounds for appeal in writing. When a parent is informed of a decision to refuse their child a place at the school, correspondence will include:

- The reason why admission was refused.
- Information about the right to appeal.
- The deadline for lodging an appeal.
- The contact details for making an appeal.

The Local Authority, on behalf of Castle Donington College, will set out the reasons for the decision, confirm that there is a right of appeal and explain the process for hearing such appeals. An independent appeals panel will be established to hear the appeal. The panel will decide whether to uphold or dismiss the appeal. Where a panel upholds the appeal, Castle Donington College is required to admit the child.

Withdrawing An Offer or A Place

Castle Donington College will withdraw an offer if:

- It has been offered in error.
- A parent has not responded within a reasonable period of time (the parent will be notified that the offer may be withdrawn and given an opportunity to respond and explain).
- It is established that the offer was obtained through a fraudulent or intentionally misleading application.

Castle Donington College will not withdraw a place once a child has started at the College, except where that place was fraudulently obtained.

Waiting List

If Castle Donington College is oversubscribed, the local authority, on behalf of the College, will maintain a clear, fair and objective waiting list. Priority will continue to be based upon the oversubscription criteria.

In Year Applications

Castle Donington College takes part in the Local Authority (LA) Mid-Year Arrangements. The LA work on behalf of the school. On receipt of an in-year application:

- Allocate a place if one is available.
- If a place is not available, add the child to the waiting list and consider the application against the oversubscription criteria.
- Inform parents of their right to appeal against the refusal of a place.
- Liaise with the Local Authority regarding both the application, and its outcome, to allow the Local Authority to keep up to date figures on the availability of places in the area.

Children of UK service personnel (UK Armed Forces)

For families of service personnel with a confirmed posting to this area, Castle Donington College will:

- Allocate a place in advance, if accompanied by an official government letter which declares a relocation date and a Unit postal address or quartering area address for considering the application against the oversubscription criteria.
- Ensure that arrangements support the Government’s commitment to removing disadvantage for service children

Children from overseas

Castle Donington College will treat applications for children coming from overseas in accordance with European Union law or Home Office rules for non-European Economic Area nationals.

Children With Challenging Behaviour

Castle Donington College will not refuse to admit children in the normal admission round on the basis of their poor behaviour elsewhere except where the child has been permanently excluded from two or more schools. Castle Donington College will participate in the Fair Access Protocol in order to ensure that unplaced children are allocated a school place quickly. However, there is no duty for Castle Donington College or other admission authorities to comply with parental preference when allocating places through the Fair Access Protocol.

Where the Governing Board does not wish to admit a child with challenging behaviour outside the normal admissions round, even though places are available, it will refer the case to the Loughborough and North Charnwood Inclusion Partnership under the Fair Access Protocol. A fair access referral is only appropriate when the school is able to demonstrate a high proportion of children with challenging behaviour are already on roll.

Castle Donington College will not refuse to admit a child thought to be potentially disruptive, or likely to exhibit challenging behaviour, on the grounds that the child is first to be assessed for special educational needs.

Human Rights Act 1998

The Human Rights Act 1998 confers a right of access to education. This right does not however extend to securing a place at a particular school. Castle Donington College will consider parents’ reasons for expressing a preference when making admission decisions, though this may not necessarily result in the allocation of a place.

The Admissions Timeline

31 October 2021	Closing date for applications to the local authority.
28 February 2022	Publication of appeals timetable on website.
1 March 2022	National offer day for secondary school places.
April and May 2022	Appeals process and outcomes.
August 2022	New intake starts at school (date to be confirmed)

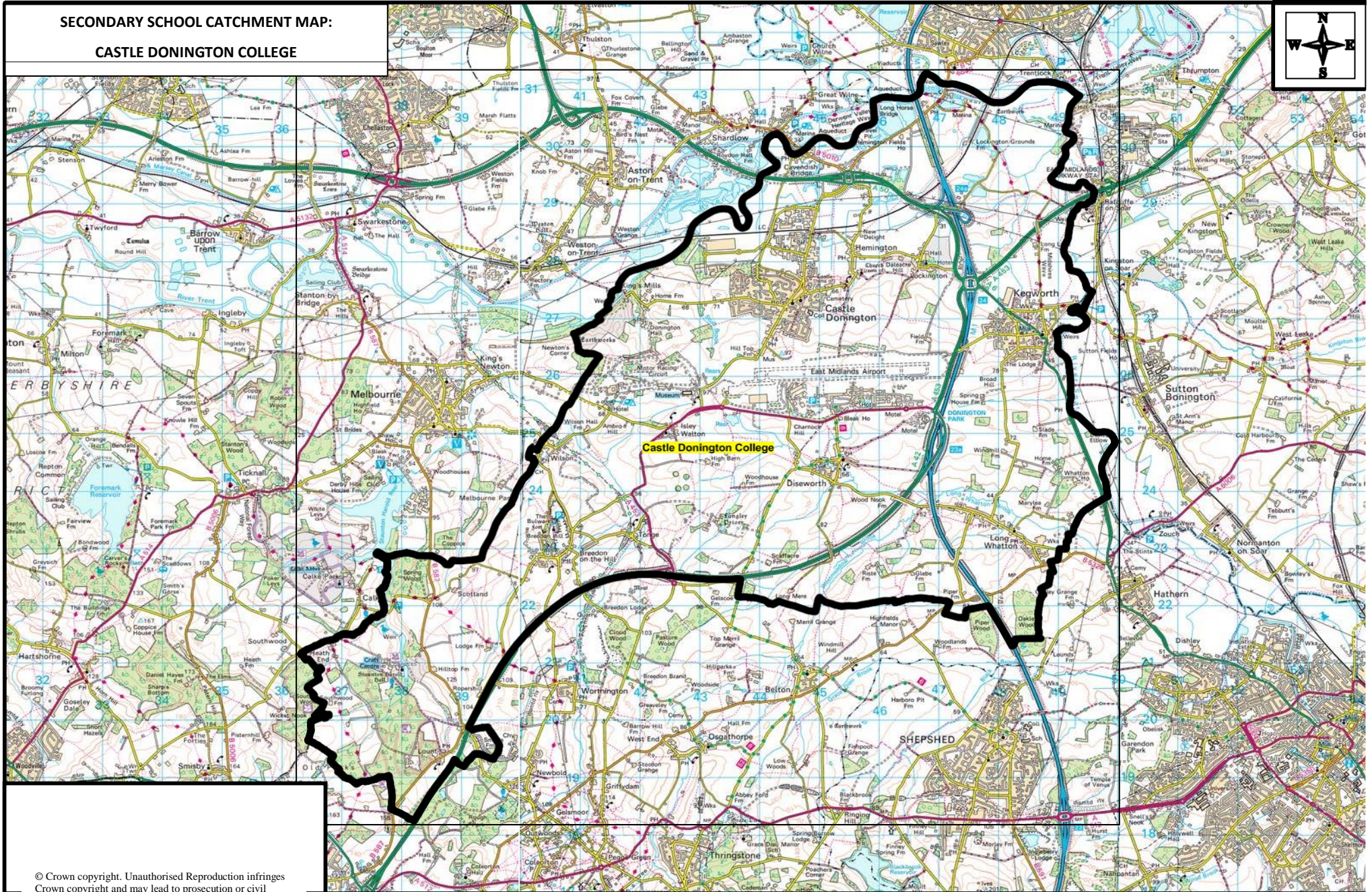
