### PE lessons during the exam season

During the period from **Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> May to Friday 25<sup>th</sup> June** some of our indoor PE spaces will be utilised as examination halls. **Consequently, we request that pupils in years 7 – 10 attend school in their CDC PE kit on their designated Core PE days, but only on days when they have practical PE.**

During this period of time, pupils will remain in their PE kit throughout the entire school day. For these PE sessions, pupils should ensure they have appropriate footwear. A reminder of the school PE kit:

PE top	Navy-blue college PE top with logo
PE bottoms	Dark coloured sports shorts, tracksuit bottoms or jogging bottoms (minimal branding)
PE trainers	Safe, sensible sports shoes

## Free School Meals eligibility

From **September 2026**, there will be a significant change to Free School Meals (FSM) eligibility in England: **All children in families receiving Universal Credit will be entitled to free school meals**, regardless of household income. This replaces the current system, where families must earn below a set income threshold to qualify.

From September 2026, your child will be eligible if you receive:

- Universal Credit (no income limit) or certain other benefits (such as Income Support)
- You will still **need to apply/register** for free school meals through your local authority or school.
- Even if your child already receives meals, **eligibility may be rechecked from September 2026**

This change is expected to help hundreds of thousands more children access a healthy school meal each day. Families could save around **£450–£500 per child each year** on lunch costs.

## Proposed School Term Dates from Autumn 2027 to Summer 2032

A [consultation on proposed school term dates](#) has been launched and will run from Tuesday 5 May to Monday 15 June. Leicestershire County Council are keen to hear your views on the proposals.

Feedback will help shape the pattern that schools follow over the next five years for schools controlled by the local authority. Although academies, including Castle Donington College, choose their own dates, we largely still align with the council's patterns.

The consultation includes two options for term dates for the academic years from Autumn 2027 to Summer 2032.

Both options keep Leicestershire's early start to the summer holidays, around two weeks earlier than neighbouring local authorities.

- Option one is a continuation of the current term date pattern.
- Option two preserves the early summer break and includes an earlier start to the autumn term to accommodate a two-week October half-term.
